Family Project: Hawaii

Soon after Betsey was freed from slavery, she became a missionary to the people in Hawaii. As you learn about the people of the Pacific Islands, take time to pray for the Christians there and the people who don't yet know about Jesus! Read and discuss Matthew 28 v 16-20 and Revelation 7 v 9-11 together to learn about God's heart for all peoples.
