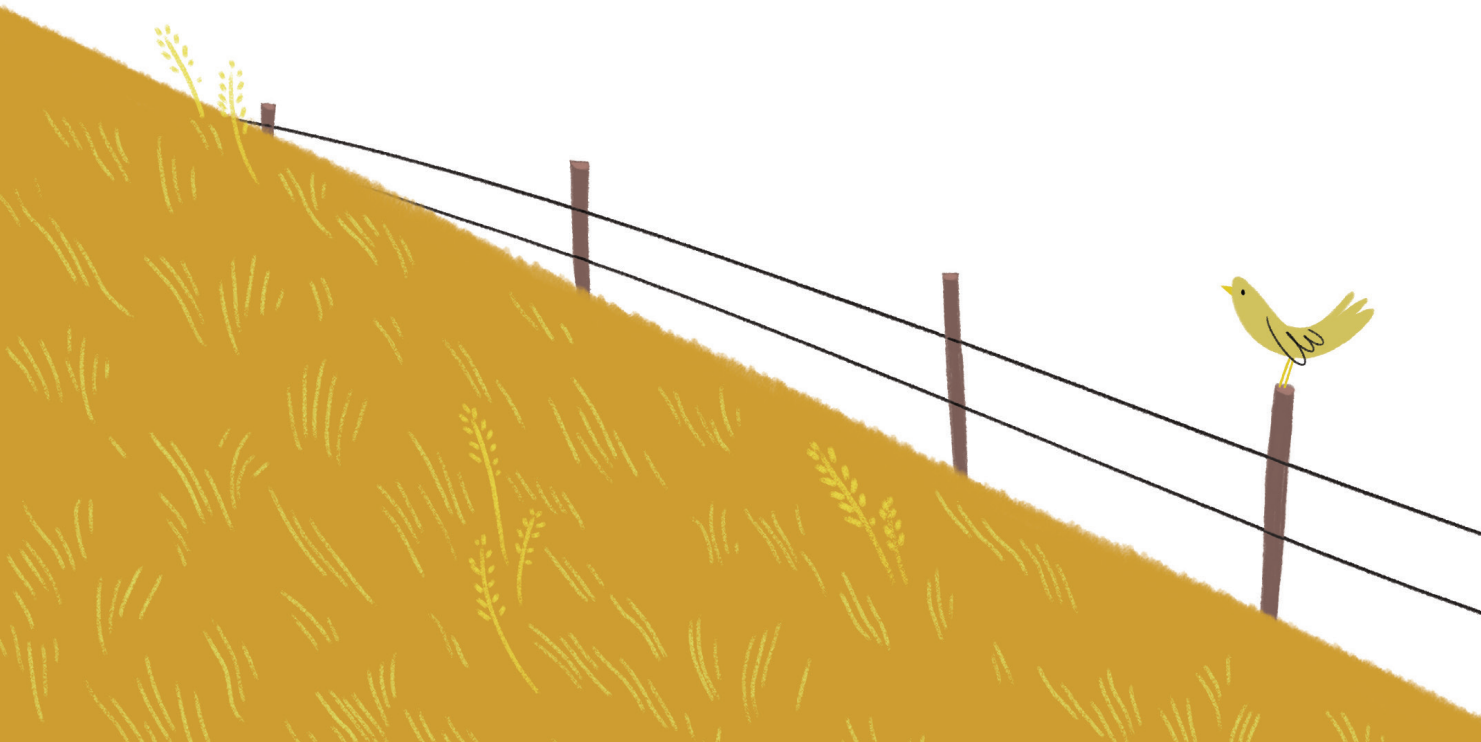




Betty loved to look at the sky and watch the aeroplanes fly by.

Betty knew exactly how to spend it.

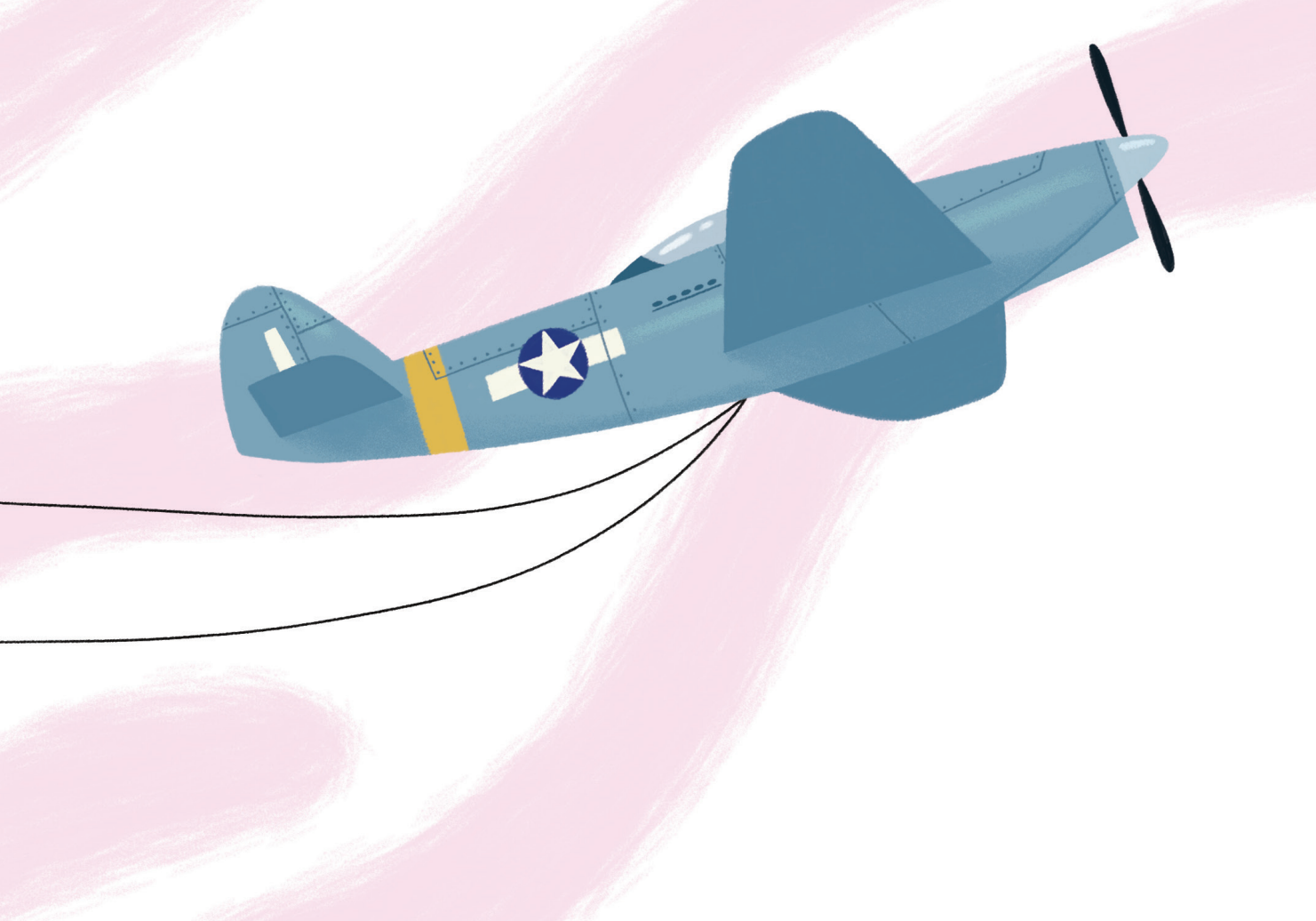
Flying lessons!
